**The Psalmody**

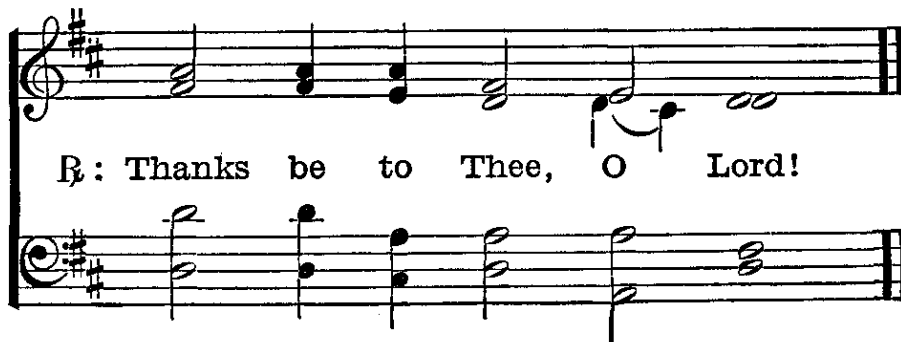

Then may follow a brief Exhortation or*

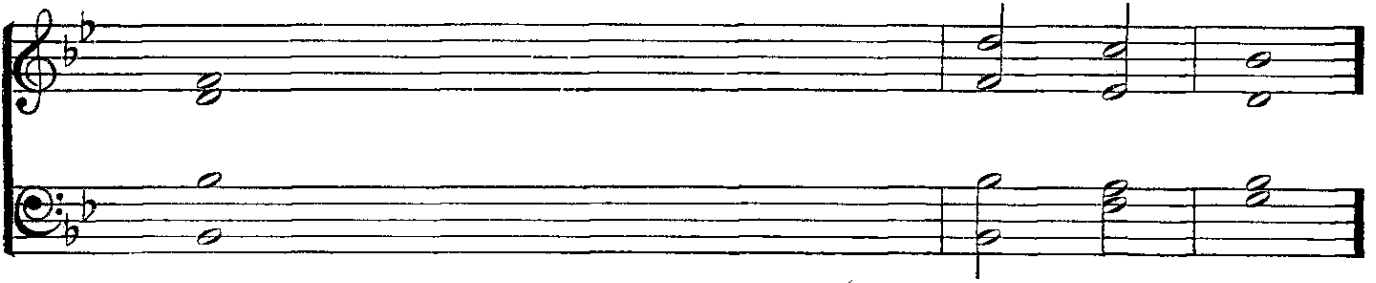

Other Canticles may be used on other days*

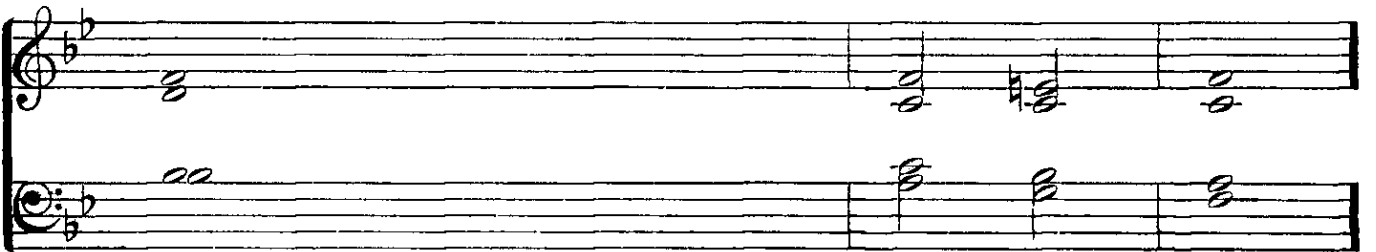
